

## PIRE - Coastal Flood Risk Reduction Program: 2023 Application for Field Research in the Netherlands



## **Application Information**

Please read the application thoroughly and answer all questions fully. Incomplete applications will not be processed.

The application process consists of two rounds: a letter of intent (LOI) and a full research proposal. The application form, LOI, and Curriculum Vitae (or resume) should be typed, combined and submitted as one pdf. file (no ".zip" files) to <a href="mailto:pire@tamug.edu">pire@tamug.edu</a> by **November 13, 2022**. You will be notified by early January, 2023 of whether you are encouraged to submit a full research proposal. Full research proposals are due by **January 22, 2023** and final selection will be announced by early March, 2023.

Since this program entails travel abroad, applicants must be in possession of a **valid passport with an expiration date after**November 30, 2023. Selected students will be asked to submit a **photocopy of their valid passport by March 10, 2023**. International students must have a valid Visa and Travel Signature on their I-20 and submit these photocopies as well.

At the time of application and travel (May 14 to 27, 2023), applicants must be **over the age of 18** and attending one of the following partner institutions: Texas A&M University (Galveston or College Station), Rice University, or Jackson State University or one of their Coastal Resilience Center partner institutions.

We especially encourage applicants from underrepresented groups, including: women, persons with disabilities, Black, Hispanic, Native Americans, Alaska Natives, Native Hawaiians and other Pacific Islanders.

**Statement of Confidentiality:** The information contained in this application will only be used to determine the applicant's eligibility for the NSF PIRE – Coastal Flood Risk Reduction Program. All information received is confidential.

Note: In-person Orientation for selected students will take place on April 6, 2023 at Texas A&M University Galveston campus. To ensure your effective participation in the program, orientation attendance is mandatory.
